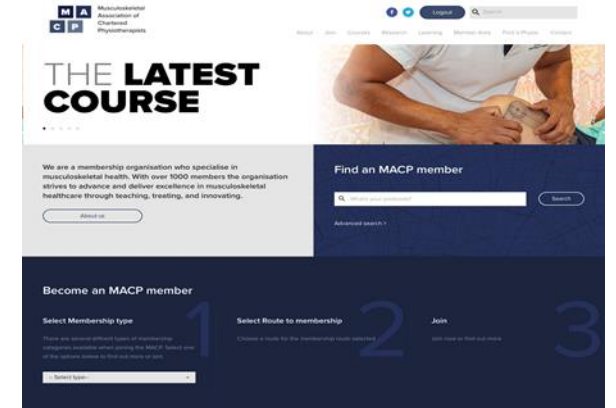

# Advanced Practice Work Stream: MSK AP Standard Development

The MACP and its accredited routes to membership will continue to be based within the established current IFOMPT standards. These include current HEI and standard portfolio routes and also a new proposed accelerated route.

HEE have not yet agreed any MSK standards across Physiotherapy or any other professions. This work is still currently out to consultation. If HEE were to adopt any standards informed by the IFOMPT standards, this would be completed with full collaboration and agreement between IFOMPT and HEE.

HEE have commissioned work to develop standards that could be used across MSK, however this work is yet to be completed and any recommendations would require consultation and agreement from all stakeholders before any standards were adopted.

# Advanced Practice Work Stream: Governance

The Centre for Advancing Practice is currently evaluating University courses for accreditation by the Centre. The MACP has formally submitted an application for all existing routes to full membership to be considered for accreditation.

HEE is considering working in partnership with the MACP to develop a franchise type model that would essentially mean that the educational standards and governance model (once agreed by HEE) would be held by the organisation and therefore members of that organisation who meet the standards would automatically be accredited by the Centre for Advanced Practice.

The MACP is working with the Centre and HEE to establish if they can;

- Help define the MSK standards and so provide members with the greatest opportunity to gain Advanced Practitioner status.
- Offer a franchise model based on the organisation's governance and educational models for future MACP members to use to gain advanced status whilst also becoming MACP members.
- Offer non-traditional routes (Portfolio) in tandem with HEI routes that will encourage current clinicians working in advanced clinics that are not members to become members, and subsequently support them to gaining AP Accreditation.

## **Virtual Platforms**

The MACP Executive Committee had been exploring virtual platforms prior to this year's national lockdown to support virtual meetings, online courses, meetings and to support MACP portfolio delivery.

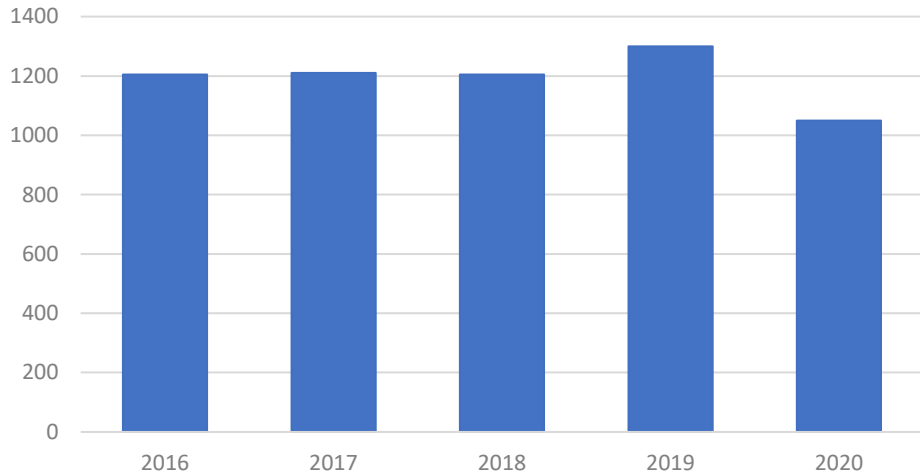

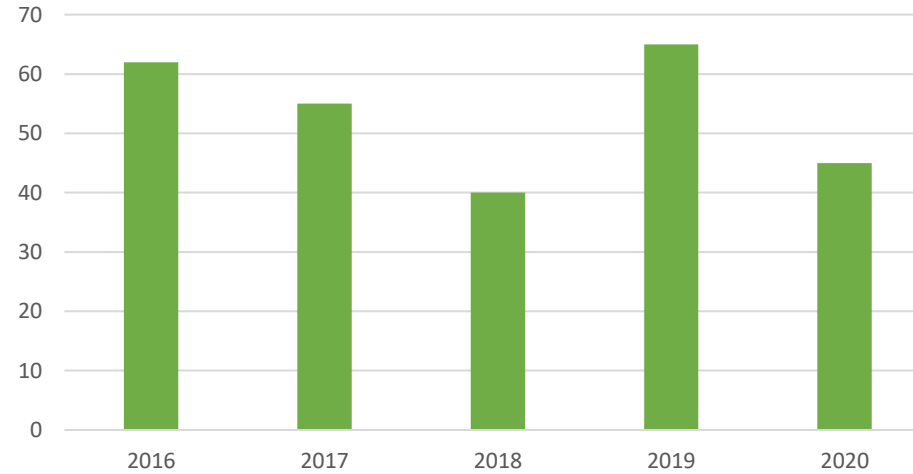


# MACP Membership & trends : 2016 - 2020

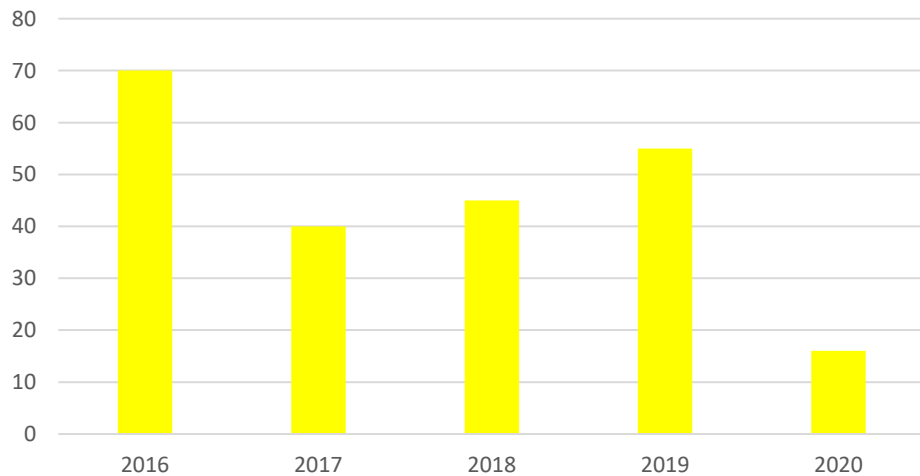

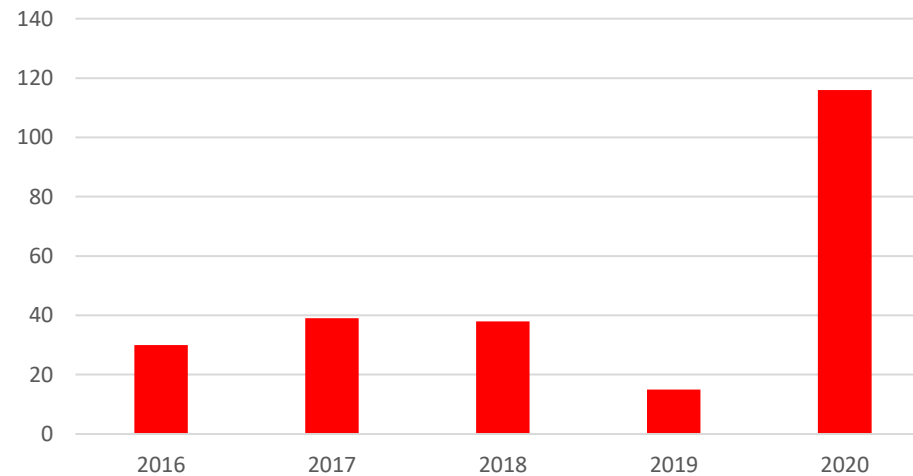

## Lapsed / Retired Members



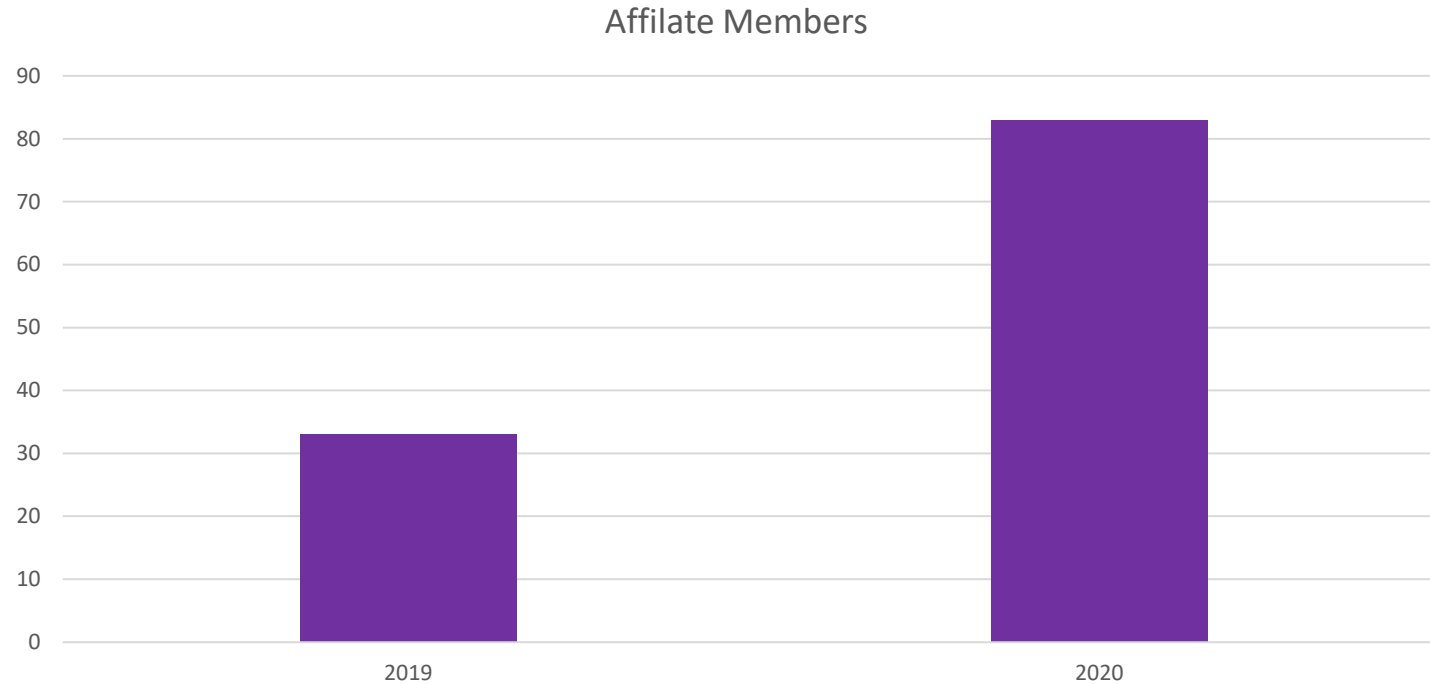
Drop in membership from 2019 – 2020 reflects an adjustment of membership numbers via the database.

## Rachel Chester

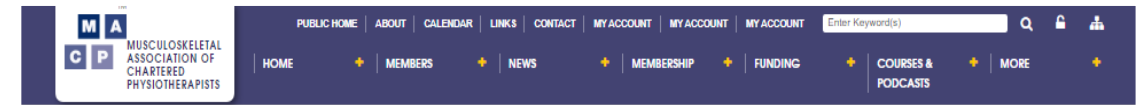

## MACP AWARDS AND BURSARIES 2017-2018

The MACP aims to support, promote and develop its members with education and research activities. The total amount of funding the MACP has committed to support its members has recently risen from £19,000 to £31,000 each year. This is available through a number of awards that have been divided into awards that support education and continuous professional development, and awards that support research activities.

The Education and CPD Awards & bursaries aim to provide financial assistance to allow its members to further their education where, as a result, there is a strong likelihood of a meaningful change to practice and patient care. The Research awards aim to support the development, undertaking and dissemination of research findings in the field of neuromusculoskeletal physiotherapy.

We encourage all MACP member to apply for these awards. In a typical year 75% of applicants are successful in their application being awarded, and some awards do not always receive an application each round. # Jayne Davies

Since joining the executive committee in 2015 Jayne has transformed the Professional development committee into a dynamic expert professional organization running high quality MSK courses in venues across the country. This has not only taken expert organization and communication skills but the ability to identify educational needs of developing physiotherapist and sourcing high quality course to meet those demands.

Jayne has risen to the challenge of Covid 19 and redesigned the course format to meet the virtual environment while maintaining the MACP quality mark of excellence. Our PDC remain the envy of other professional networks who recognized the work that Jayne has put in to develop the role. This continued drive for advancing excellence in musculoskeletal health has led to Jayne being recognised for specialist contributions to the MACP.
